## Cultural Council recognizes key arts supporters

The Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville honored people and organizations that are creating changes for the better in the arts community.

The award recipients were Erik Hart, Daniel Wynn, Target Stores and The Sea Turtle Inn.

Hart, who has headed the Florida Theatre for 16 years, was given the Individual Art Award for expanding entertainment choices and making the theater available to community organizations at low cost.
